

Tech Tips: -

Fluid Loss: Your radiator is leaking and you're in the middle of no-where. There's no repair shop in sight.

Quick Fix: Dump in a small container of ground black pepper. The pepper won't dissolve, but instead it will remain in suspension in the fluid. This will temporarily plug minor leaks until you can get to a repair shop.

Basement Odors: Try taking a shower. If that doesn't help, it could be that the water in the drain trap has evaporated, allowing odors to come up from the sewer. You could add water, but for little-used floor drains, pour non-toxic anti-freeze (RV anti-freeze) into the drain. It doesn't evaporate as fast as water.

Next meeting is May 6th and that is a Food Pantry night. The June meeting will include a presentation by NAPA.



April Meet Guest Speaker Turtle Wax Representative

The guest speaker at the April chapter meeting was Michael Schultz, Product Developer at Turtle Wax . Turtle Wax is the leading car wax productand Michael was here to demon-

strate the latest and most popular products, the ICE line of finish protectants.

Turtle wax is a local company – started on the north side of Chicago. The original product was called Plastone, but a visit to Turtle Creek near Beloit gave Ben Hirsch the idea to call it Turtle Wax. The company is family owned and operated since its founding in the 40's.

The company also sells other well-known products such as Marvel Mystery Oil, and CD2 engine treatment, which was originally developed for Buick before detergent oil was available. The companies most popular product other than wax is the headlight lens restorer kit. 15,000 units are sold a month.

Michael discussed how to remove wax without adding swirl marks, the special challenges of black cars(you GN guys take note) and interior care. Also, do you know which is the LEAST durable car color? It also happens to be the most popular. No, it's not black, but sillver. Silver paint has a high pigment-to-resin ratio, which means reduced durability.

If you did not attend the meeting, you missed you chance to ask questions about appearance car chemicals and the use, and the myths surrounding some of them. Watch for our next guest speaker.
