His - Loaded with Class

After attending my first Nationals in 1993, I decided I had to have a real GS with a big block. I found this car in the GSXtra - a Black 1972 Stage One. My brother and I flew to New York then trailered it home. It was totally disassembled, but it was a solid Arizona car, with the Arizona title. As the car was being restored I decided to option it out as much as possible. I ended up adding 19 factory options so far. It is presently four options shy of every option available. I have two of those in possession now. Tom Andresen and Ed did a great job rebuilding and waking-up the engine. Matt Kostelec did all the body and paint, installing the drive-train assembly and mechanics in 1996. The car still looks great and runs even better. I can actually feel my blood pressure go up when I get in my car and start her up. With roughly 475 horses and over 540 ft. lbs. of torque, it is nice to have all that power, as I adjust my power bucket seat, let the power windows up, turn on the air, and pop in an 8-track. It does not get much better than that.

In 1994 Cathy and I had gone to the Nationals, as we have for the past 10 years. We did not have a car to bring and just flew in. We were just looking forward to having a great time as usual. We were strolling through the grounds at the track, when we found ourselves at the car corral. There were a few

Gran Sports for sale. But one in particular caught our eye. The owner John Kozol had driven this car, a 1970 GS 350, from New York to the Nationals in hope of a sale. The closer we looked at it the better it looked. It was a numbers matching, the paint was 80% original, all original interior, buckets, console, AC, full power, rally gages, power windows, 8-track, protect-o-plate and still had the original spare in the trunk. We had not planned on buying a car, but we talked about it awhile and took it for a spin. We ended up going to the bank and driving it home. Cathy drove the car for 5 years before we decided to restore it - drive train and all! "Matt Kostelec" did a great job at putting it all back together. He did such a good job that she took second place at the 2002 Nationals. I'd never seen so much rain, but it still showed well. Cathy's not shy about driving it and does so from early spring to fall every year.

Roxanne has told me many stories about the car and its' many trips around the country, including trips to Florida for family vacations. One of the stories Roxanne told me was about one of the times driving the GS in Florida during a torrential rainstorm. The car had some miles on it at the time, but was still special to the family. Of course the car died, and they were forced to coast to a stop along the side of the road. Needless to say, Harry was not too pleased, but they eventually got help and went on their way!

Over time, I have actually been able to get Roxanne to admit blowing the transmission, and getting the car airborne over railroad tracks. Let's just say, the car was not pampered, but she did have fun with it!

When Roxanne graduated college, she bought a new car to be her daily driver. Thankfully, her love for the GS made her keep it, and store it at the summer home in Lake Geneva.

Sadly, in 1991, Roxanne's father Harry passed away. Her mother decided to sell their place in Lake Geneva, and until I met Roxanne, the car had bounced around from one storage area to another. people in the CCGSCA who have helped me get this project done. I have really come to understand what a great car the GS is.

Everything on this car has either been rebuilt, rechromed or replaced with as many original parts as possible. The goal was concourse, but with every intention of driving
