



### Beth's Grocery Gettin'/Drag Racin' Wagon

I have been into cars since I was little. I would hand my dad tools in the back yard while he tuned up his old GMC pickup, and my Uncle, a Dairy farmer, used to take me to the Tractor Pulls. When I grew up (yeah right – maybe got older?) I worked at Fel-Pro Inc., in the Dyno Lab, blowing up Ford five point nothings - talk about a fun job.

Was a Chevy girl (sorry... so sorry), but this wagon converted me completely to Buicks. From the first day I saw it online I knew I MUST have it, and about a month and a half later I did. I need to say a big thank you to Kurt "Wolfgang" Peterson of N.C. for creating the SportWagon GS, now lovingly known as "Da Wagon".

Dana, my husband, bought the car for me in Sept. 2003 as an early birthday present. Within the first 2 weeks of owning her we were at the races. Early plans were to have the body gone over & have fresh paint applied. Then came the Fresh Air Finale at Byron, when I broke her. We did make it home, the damage ending up being chunks of piston #6 bouncing around inside the 455 . .

not pretty! So the body work was set aside, as we searched for & priced engine builders.

We ended up sending her on a little "vacation" at the end of November 2003 to Jim Weise at Tri-Shield Performance in Anoka MN. We were going to have him do a simple rebuild, but we came to our senses.

Some of the upgrades are: TA Performance Stage 1 SE Aluminum Heads, TA Performance SP-1 polished intake manifold, "Car Craft" hydraulic cam with .525 lift and 231/234 duration and 110 degrees between lobe centers, TA Performance headers, Competition Cams Pro-Magnum hydraulic lifters, Hybrid adjustable pushrods, Doctor Gas 3" X pipe. The crank was ground .010, Speed Pro Forged Pistons, Billet mechanical fuel pump and a 9.5" fixed pitch converter with 2700-3000 rpm stall. I'm very happy with the results of the rebuild; if you saw me grinning like an idiot at Salem, Morocco or Byron, you now know why.
