Beauty was delivered to Roger and Marie of Balwin, Missouri on March 4, 1987, who obviously treated her very well. My father Glenn Dempsey purchased the car on December 23, 1998, with 35,000 miles on it. He just wanted a very nice Turbo Regal that was not black. Being an all white T-Type I was not impressed.

Born into a serious car family, I was interested in cars from the get go, but I had always loved Mustangs. When the car came back in May 2003 after the restoration with the PPG Steel Grey Pearl paint over the Chrysler White paint, job, I fell in love. Dad also treated this Turbo Regal to the normal modifications including a TE44, Terry Houston down pipe, 36 lb injectors, chrome MAF pipe, 2 ½ inch Hooker exhaust system, Casper Ultra Chip, Casper Voltage Booster, oil pump booster plate and a drive shaft loop. Dad also added an underdrive pulley set, new radiator, belts, BF Goodrich TA tires and Boyd custom wheels. Then there was the special touches such as the trailer and cooler

painted to match the car. It adds to the impact this Beauty brings when making the grand entrance to a car show. The trailer plates "INSTNT T" is what Dad had named this car.

I got hooked on the Buick community and this car when I went with Dad to the GS Nationals in 2007. That was a trip of a lifetime, bringing very fond memories. Beauty's next trip to the Nationals was to spread Dad's ashes. Many of you may remember the fantastic burn out Beauty performed for my brother Guy in the Holiday Inn University Plaza parking lot. He started in the Marriott parking lot across the street continued the burn out all the way around the parking lot over speed bumps and around the corners returning to the Marriott still smoking the tires. Kind of tough on the TE 44 turbo, but is part of the GS Nationals folklore.

Since buying the car from Dad's estate, I've added a knock gauge, a 5557E

Paul received a four piston Trophy which was handmade by Bill Grupp and \$155 cash winnings! Second place went to Pete Van Tholen who will receive a three piston trophy and \$100 cash winnings, Third Place saw Loyd Bonecutter get a two piston trophy and \$50 cash winnings, and fourth place went to Brian Henrickson with a single piston trophy and a handshake (Sorry, no money payout to 4th place). Congratulations to all and many thanks to Bill Grupp for the very cool and unique handmade trophies with Genuine Buick 455 pistons.

We also had six different racers win the Best Reaction Time competition. Those racers were as follows: Race One, Pete Van Tholen (.011), Race Two, Keith Egan (.055), Race Three, Loyd Bonecutter (.023), Race Four, Cliff Bryan (unk), Race Five, Paul Brelie (unk), Race Six, Scott Pitts (.005). Each racer received \$25 and 10 points. This year we only had two racers win the "Run On Your Dial-In" competition, Brian Henrickson in race three and Steve Else in race five. Both racers received \$25 and 10 points.
