For participants of our Chicagoland Chapter drag racing series, Pete Van Tholen is a regular racer. This particular car is not raced, but has been with Pete since it was new.

Pete is part of the Harders' Gang that regularly meets at Brian Hendricksen's shop. The original group all graduated from Timothy Christian in the early 1980s, and included Steve Van Byssum, Pete Van Tholen, Brian Hendricksen, Dave Smith, Dan Rocco, and Ed Wolters.

The first Gran Sport owned by Steve Van Byssum influenced this group of young men to eventually own their own big block Buick Gran Sports. It was a 1972 Emerald Green car sporting a 350 engine. This car was driven to High School and parked at a friend's house across the street. The gang used to stare at this car while in class every day and dream of the freedom this car represented.

Once Brian purchased the shop the group of friends started hanging out there, with the group expanding to Perry Carlini, and Jack Fisher. Eventually the group converted to owning Buicks with Brian and Steve the ring leaders.

Pete bought a 1984 dark blue metallic T-Type in 1984, based on the test drive performance at McCaullife Buick in Wheaton. He did not realize at the time the treat he was in for, as he chose the Buick Regal due to the groups preference for Buicks and the need for a car to drive. He owned that car for two year putting about 37,000 hard charging miles on the car, but when his brother gave him a ride in a 1986 Grand National the hot air car had to go. Continued from Page 1 In early August 1986 Pete purchased the 1986 T-Type shown in the picture above at Packet Buick in Maywood after seeing it on his travels through the area.

In the first year he put about 15,000 miles on the car, but when he got the company truck, the car was retired to weekend duty, and an occasional drive by his brother when he traded in his GN for a Corvette. The T-Type now has 21,000 miles on it and is bone stock, except for the intake air system, upgraded charged air hoses off as the stock ones blew off, three sets of speedometer cables that broke when exceeding the 85 mph limit and R215-65 BF Goodrich tires replacing the older original Eagle GT tires. Having paid for the car before having kids, this car mainly sits in the garage, with occasional car show appearances and weekend duties.



One afternoon in the early 1990s Pete grew quite fond of big block Buicks when Steve blasted by him in his 1970 triple black GS on 31<sup>st</sup> Street west of Wolf Road while on a aggressive jaunt. This need for speed was met on July 4, 2007 when Pete bought the 1970 four speed GS. The first weekend of ownership brought the car to the CCGSCA race where it pulled low 13s with the four speed on street tires. The first winter the engine was pulled and freshened up with 20 over diamond pistons, and SPI intake replacing the Edelbrock Performer manifold, Stage II aluminum heads and headers. That combination twisted axles so a Chevy 12 bolt differential was installed. Finally an TH-400 was installed to limit the damage to final drive parts. Last fall at the GS Nationals this car pulled a respectable 11.46 at 119 with a 1.6 plus 60 ft. time.



This car has been restored to stock with the original engine with ported stock heads, a Edelbrock B4B and the four speed. New inner fenders and core support were added to restore the front end to like new condition.

The latest installment of Pete's need for speed is his race ready 1969 GS equipped with a 12 bolt differential equipped with 4.33 gears that are to be changed to 4.10. The blue block Pete purchased from Heavy D is at AMP getting prepared with his Stage 2 heads and SP1 with goodies specified by Perry Carlini. This Mike Phillips prepared engine will be coupled with the Turbo 400 from the 1970 car to be an planned 800 HP beast. Brian Hendricksen has done his magic on the wiring for the machine to be reliable at the drag strip, and cleaned up a lot of other.



This will be quite the racing season with Pete's new Buick, Perry Carlini & Dan Rocco with new engines, Brian Hendricksen with a freshly prepared 430, and Ed showing off his freshly painted 1971 GS at a race or two. Look out Turbo Regal Racers the Big Block cars from Harder's will be out in force.

#### Shari Bonecutter's Memories

Shari was from a car family. Her Father was always on the hunt for another car, often purchasing cars targeted for friends and relatives who had a need. He was not into working on them, having enough resources to have those services provided for him.

When we would see a particular car, Shari would often say, Dad got mom a convertible like that.

Being into motorcycles Shari would ride with me where ever the road would take us. We spent quite a few vacations with days on end riding to a destination.

In the fall of 1989 we purchased the Grand National, the moment on our lives were changed. At the Bonecutter reunion of August 1990, our cousin Earl ran out to greet us in the Grand National, declaring wait until your cousin Belva sees this. At that reunion we received information on all things Buick that we soon learned for ourselves.

My first GS Nationals was in 1993 and Shari joined me in 1995, which was a definite hook, so we never missed one since. Our introduction to the Chicagoland Chapter was in 1996 through a letter from Steve Russo and Bernie Rekus, inviting us to join in on the local fun. At the time we heavily involved with the Chicago Beer Society and they seemed to have activities on the same dates. Therefore our first meeting was the Christmas Party at Bernie's house on the south suburbs. Since we had to leave relatively early we met early comers to the party.

Our meeting Bernie and Steve resulted in our being invited to newsletter folding parties, that of course extended to our having a picnic in our back yard in 1997, which turned out huge, to helping arrange activities, to starting the Chapter Website to eventually being fully involved.

Shari's membership responsibilities came along shortly when the data base crashed once and we had to bring our laptops over to Kurt Hoover's place to type in all the available data, then combine to one spreadsheet.

As you all know Shari took to running the club as it was a natural hidden talent she had. She was always there to lend a hand and often took an idea and ran off with it, arranging all the details from who needed to be involved in setting up, to securing their trust and commitment, to making sure the membership knew about the event and who needed to fill in each necessary component, and bring the necessary materials.

Her "membership scribbling" were often completed long before we had the cover car information and I got around to writing my little bit. Often I would consult her section first in order to just not repeat what she had already said, therefore keeping mine short. I just got through reading her last entry and discovered it is like reading minutes for most every meeting we had. Will truly miss this insight. She truly ran the CCGSCA.


